



Objectives

Build capacity and help modernise higher education institutions in Partner Countries, to ensure a structural, long-lasting impact

- Support modernisation & internationalisation
- Improve quality
- Improve the level of competences and skills
- Enhance management, governance in HEIs
- Promote people-to-people contacts, intercultural understanding
- Voluntary convergence with EU HE policy developments





Capacity-building for higher education in brief

- **1.Joint Projects:** New curricula, joint degrees, learning and teaching methodologies, staff development, quality assurance, governance, Bologna tools
- 2.Structural Projects: Reforms at national level with the support of the authorities in the Partner Countries (policy modernisation, Bologna policies, governance and management of higher education systems...)







Additional Mobility Component

Projects for Southern Mediterranean, Eastern Europe and Western Balkans countries may include an additional mobility component

- for students and staff, to and from Programme Countries and between Partner Countries
- same rules as for credit mobility (max 12 months)





How does it work?

- Projects of 2 or 3 years
- Projects run by consortium of institutions
- Consortium must include Programme Countries and Partner Countries
- Project can be coordinated by an institution from a Programme or a Partner Country



Must address

National priorities set for Partner Country in Regions 1, 2, 3, 7, 10

Regional priorities for the regions where no national priorities are established: Regions 6, 8, 9,11

Defined by the **Commission** and based on EU's external policy priorities

Must address

the **regional priorities** for countries in the same region (regional projects)

<u>or</u>

regional / national priority common to different regions (cross-regional projects)

What is assessed? Award Criteria

Relevance (30 points)

Quality of Design + **Implementation** (30 points)

Quality of Team + Cooperation arrangements (20 points)

Impact and Sustainability

(20 points)

To be considered for funding, proposals must score at least 60 points in total and - out of these points at least 15 points for "Relevance"





Summary of Results 1st Call

Proposals recommended for funding: 140 (27% from 515 submitted)

Proposals with Partner Country coordinator: 28 (20%)

Joint Projects: **122** (87%)

Structural Projects: 18 (13%)

National: 53 (38%)


Multi-country: 87 (62%)

Average consortium size: 12 partners (min. 6 -max. 34)

Average budget: 880.000 €

Lessons Learned

- ✓ Relatively high percentage of **ineligible applications** (12%) due to insufficient understanding of minimum requirements for consortia;
- ✓ Limited number of applications in Asia and South Africa;
- ✓ National/regional priorities established for the Partner Country need to be respected and matched with the local needs (assessed in award criterion 'relevance');
- ✓ A need to mobilise **new institutions** (not the usual suspects) both in Programme and Partner Countries, **as grant holders and/or partners**;
- ✓ Outreach beyond the capital cities to institutions in the regions and the periphery;
- ✓ Lack of innovative approaches (new content and methodologies);



Key messages for the 2nd Call

- ✓ Intensify efforts to encourage the cooperation with Asian countries;
- ✓ Disseminate widely the new opportunity to cooperate with ACP countries;
- ✓ Pay particular attention to the eligibility criteria, mainly minimum number of nationally recognised HEIs in consortia;
- ✓ Respect strictly the national / regional priorities addressed to each
 Partner Country affecting the score on Relevance (threshold of 50%
 must be reached to pass to the next selection stages);
- ✓ Insist on the need to empower the Partner Country partners from the early stages of the proposal preparation.

Assessment of projects by experts (remotely)	mid-March – mid May 2016		
Consultation procedure	mid-May – mid-June 2016		
Evaluation Committee for selection of projects	early July 2016		
Sending for signature of Award decision by Agency AO	mid-July 2016		
Notification of applicants & publication of results	end-July 2016		
Preparation and signature of grant agreements	August-September 2016		
Start of eligibility period	15 October 2016
