- <u>42 national units</u> based in 38 countries participating in the Erasmus + program (28 Member States, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Montenegro, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Norway, Serbia and Turkey)
- <u>a coordinating unit</u> based in the EU Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency in Brussels

- Reports are multilingual on-line encyclopedia that aims to present national education systems across Europe
- Description of national education systems is product that aims at presenting the most comprehensive and accurate picture of education systems and reforms in Europe
