Higher Education in Montenegro

Implemented based on the principles of the Law on Higher Education, adopted in June 2017. Educational activities at Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) carried out through academic and applied study programmes, as well as through various professional development and training programmes. There are:

- 1 public HEI in Montenegro
- 3 private HEIs
- 1 independent public faculty
- 4 independent private faculties.

Quality assurance

Carried out by the new established Agency for Controll and Quality Assurance of Higher Education and the Higher Education Council.

Quality assurance includes accreditation, self-evaluation and reaccreditation.

Academic integrity

Montenegro stands out as the first country in the Balkan region to regulate academic integrity by a specific law, the Law on Academic Integrity, adopted in March 2019.

Cooperation with numerous universities worldwide, based on the bilateral agreements signed.

Comprehensive **student help package by the Ministry of Education**, which consists of scholarships for the best students and student loans. Out of the total number of students at the University of Montenegro, 21% of students are financed from the budget, if they have the status of budget students, while others pay tuition from their own funds and have the status of self-financing students. **Students with disabilities** are exempt from paying tuition fees at all HEIs in Montenegro.
